Verbs are **action words**. Verbs are things that you can do!

I	run	in the park.
You	eat	pizza.
We	write	my homework.
They	walk	to my house.
	go	to school.
	play	with my friend.

- **Can you run?** Yes!
"Run" is a verb!
- **Can you eat?** Yes!
"Eat" is a verb!
- **Can you write?** Yes!
"Write" is a verb!

→ With **He, She,** and **It,** you have to add **-s** (or **-es**) to the verb:

He	runs	in the park.
She	eats	pizza.
It	writes	my homework.
	walks	to my house.
	goes	to school.
	plays	with my friend.

- Wrong: He run in the park. (x)
- Right: He **runs** in the park.
- Wrong: She play with me. (x)
- Right: She **plays** with me.
