The **subject** of a sentence is the most important noun in the sentence.

The **subject** is what the sentence is about.

The **subject** is usually the first noun in the sentence.

**My car is dirty.**

- The **subject** of the sentence is "car" (or "my car").

- What is the sentence about? ("I")
- The **subject** of the sentence is "I."
