- You can use **will + verb (or won't + verb)**:
 - I **will go** to the supermarket tomorrow.
 - Jackie **won't play** soccer because she is sick.

- You can also use **Be verb + going to + verb**:
 - I **am going to go** to the supermarket tomorrow.
 - Jackie **is not going to play** soccer because she is sick.
