

Adjectives are words that describe nouns. Adjectives can also be **Comparative**– this means that you can use adjectives to **compare** different things.

With most short adjectives (1 or 2 syllables), you add "-er."

- big > bigger
- funny > funnier
- fast > faster

With longer adjectives, you add the word "more."

- important > more important
- interesting > more interesting
- beautiful > more beautiful

*If an adjective ends in "consonant-y," you have to change the y to i, then add -er. (funnier, easier)

*If an adjective ends in "short vowel - consonant," you have to double the consonant, then add -er. (bigger, thinner)
