




- "Let's play tag," said Ape.

"I wish we had a park," said Baboon. "It would be fun to slide and swing."




Mama put her arms around Baboon. He leaned against her. Soon he was sleeping.




Ape shook Baboon. "I've got a surprise! Wait until you see it!"
