“More apples!” said Jane, a day later. “Who is bringing them?”




► On the third day, Brett said, “Listen! Can you hear something?”




► They stood at the window and looked out. A girl walked past their high fence.

► “Who is she?” asked Jane.




“I’ve just remembered
