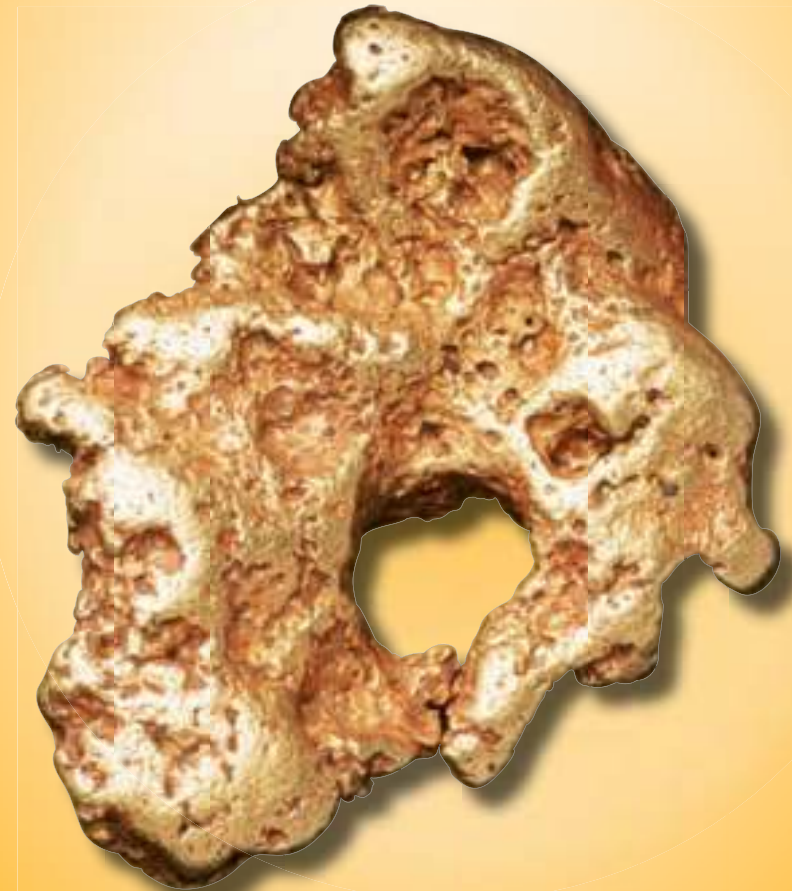

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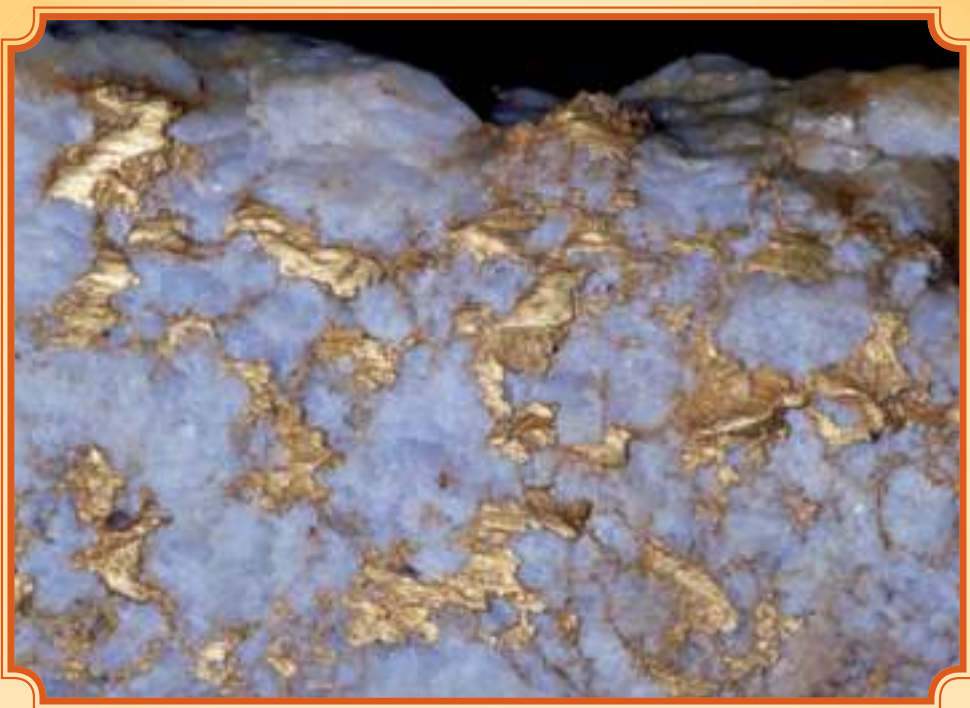
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Where can you find

Scaffolded Language Development

POSITION WORDS Remind children that some words are connecting words that often tell the position of something. Ask children where you can find gold. Suggest that they look back at the book, if necessary. Write the correct answers on the board: *Gold is under the ground. It is in rocks. Gold is in rivers. Gold is in shops.* In the first answer, circle the connecting word. Then have children come to the board and circle the connecting words in the remaining answers. Invite children to read the sentences chorally, placing emphasis on *in* and *under*. Then ask children to correctly use either *in* or *under* in the following sentences.

1. The river is _____ the bridge.
2. The fruit is _____ the bowl.
3. It is dry _____ the umbrella.
4. The toy is _____ the store.

Write Sentences Discuss with children that people can buy things made of gold in shops. Have children write sentences telling why they think people buy and sell things made of gold.
