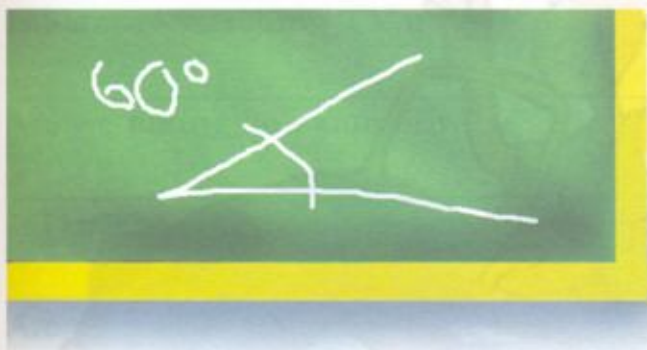


The children are playing in the yard now.



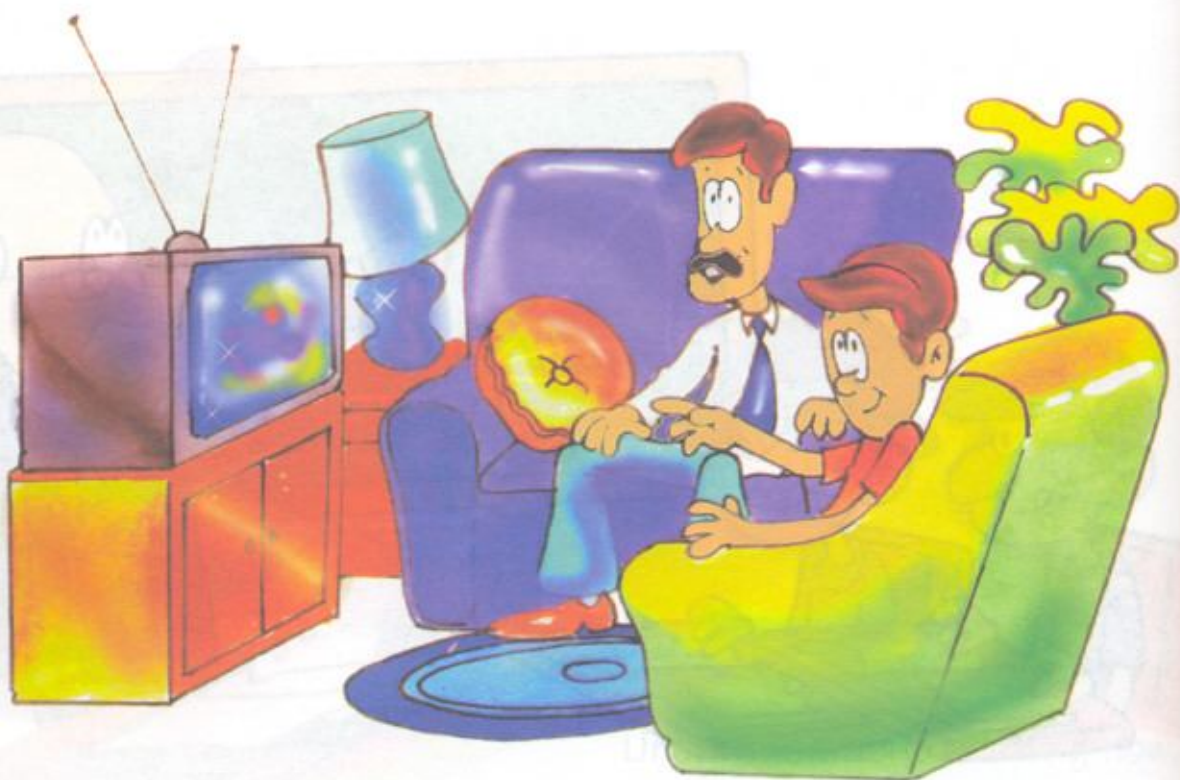


The teacher is teaching the students now.

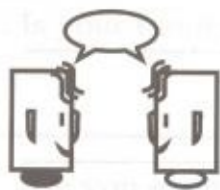
