Wi-Fi Vs. Cellular Data

Wi-Fi is wireless access to the Internet. On a smartphone, you can use Wi-Fi at home or in places where free Wi-Fi is offered. If no Wi-Fi is available, you have to use cellular data from your service provider to access the Internet.


