

Lesson 14

Shopping

Look at these pictures. Say something about them.



Anita and John are shopping for different things.

Anita is grocery shopping. She goes to the supermarket to buy groceries for her family. There are five people in her family, so she buys a lot of groceries every week. She buys meat, fish, bread, milk, rice, tea bags, coffee, cheese, cereal and cookies from the supermarket. The groceries cost \$75.00. After the supermarket Anita goes to the outdoor market. She goes there because the fruit and vegetables are fresher. She buys lots of fruit and vegetables for her family. She spends \$15.00 at the outdoor market. After the outdoor market Anita goes to the convenience store to buy some snacks for her family. The store is near her house. She spends \$5.00 at the convenience store.

John needs to buy some school supplies. He goes to the stationery store. He buys 2 notebooks, some marker pens, an eraser and a plastic folder. He spends \$10.00 at the stationery store. After the stationery store, John goes to the bookstore. He needs to buy a dictionary. He spends \$7.00 at the bookstore. On the way home, John feels a little hungry and thirsty. He goes to the convenience store to buy a snack and a drink-box. He spends \$3.00 at the convenience store.

Dialogue: Anita sees John at the convenience store.

Anita: *Hi John, how are you today?*

John: *I'm fine Anita, how about you?*

Anita: *I'm a little tired.*

John: *What have you been doing today?*

Anita: *I have been grocery shopping for my family.*

John: *Where did you go?*

Anita: *First I went to the supermarket, and then to the outdoor market.*

John: *I have been shopping, as well.*

Anita: *Have you been grocery shopping, too?*

John: *No, I have been buying some school supplies.*

Anita: *Where did you go?*

John: *Well, I needed some notebooks and pens, so I went to the stationery store. I also needed a dictionary, so I went to the bookstore.*

Anita: *What are you going to buy here?*

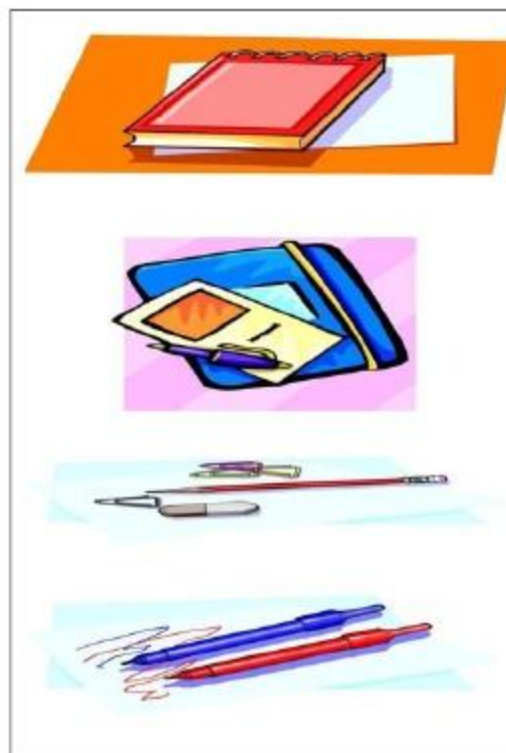
John: *I'm going to buy a snack and a drink-box. Shopping always makes me hungry and thirsty!*
