# Words that are used together (collocations)

Collocations are words that go together in a natural way. When you learn a word, you need to learn the words that go with it to make a sentence.

Many collocations are formed with a verb and a noun. It is very important to use the right verb, and a good dictionary will help you with this. For example, you say **watch TV**, NOT see TV or look at the TV.

Here are some other useful collocations formed with a verb and a noun:

I have a shower before breakfast.

We usually have dinner at eight o'clock.

I left school when I was 16.

I love playing football.

There are also other kinds of collocations. Here are some more useful ones:

What do you do in your free time? (adjective + noun)

I'll give you my phone number. (noun + noun)

When did you get married? (verb + adjective)

It's time to go home. (verb + adverb)

## What gets you up in the mornings?

Do you enjoy your job?
I love it! The only thing I don't love is that
I start work at six o'clock in the morning,
so I have to get up very early.

How did you become a radio journalist?

I'm very lucky! I got a job as an assistant at my local radio station after I left school. One day, one of journalists asked me to present a show with him, as a one-off. That's how it all started!

What do you do in your free time?

I enjoy playing the piano, and I read a lot of books, but often I'm so tired, that I just watch TV.
