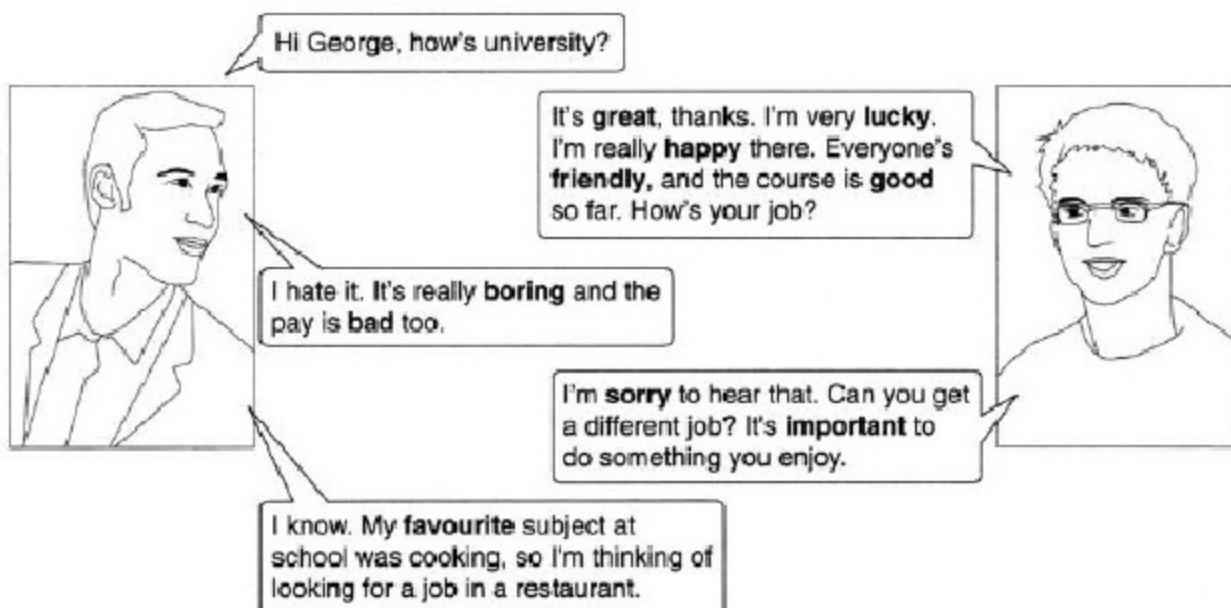

Words for talking about feelings

Word Finder	bad	1 ADJECTIVE Something that is bad is unpleasant or harmful. 2 ADJECTIVE Something that is bad is of a very low standard, quality, or amount.
	boring	ADJECTIVE Someone or something that is boring is not at all interesting.
	favourite	ADJECTIVE Favourite is used for describing the thing or person that you like more than all the others.
	feelings	PLURAL NOUN Your feelings about something are the things you think and feel about it.
	fine	ADJECTIVE If you are fine , you are well or happy.
	friendly	ADJECTIVE If someone is friendly , they behave in a pleasant, kind way.
	funny	ADJECTIVE Someone or something that is funny is amusing and likely to make you smile or laugh.
	good	ADJECTIVE Good means pleasant or enjoyable.
	great	ADJECTIVE If something is great , it is very good or enjoyable.
	happy	ADJECTIVE Someone who is happy feels pleased and satisfied.
	hungry	ADJECTIVE When you are hungry , you want to eat.
	important	ADJECTIVE If something is important to you, you feel that you must do, have, or think about it.
	lucky	ADJECTIVE You say that someone is lucky when they have good luck.
	nice	ADJECTIVE If something is nice , it is attractive, pleasant, or enjoyable.
	sad	ADJECTIVE If you are sad , you feel unhappy.
	sorry	ADJECTIVE If you are sorry about a situation, you feel regret, sadness, or disappointment about it.
	tired	ADJECTIVE If you are tired , you feel that you want to rest or sleep.
