
Signs and notices




You use the exit to leave a building.




You can't buy things here at the moment.




They mustn't give bread to the ducks.

Good to know!

Remember that information is uncountable. You should never put an 's' at the end of it or 'an' in front of it:

We want some information about train times.

Words for talking about signs and notices

bus	NOUN A bus is a large motor vehicle that carries passengers.
closed	ADJECTIVE When a shop or place is closed , it is not open and you cannot buy or do anything there.
do not	PHRASE If a sign says do not park here, you are not allowed to park your car there.
exit	NOUN The exit is the door that you use to leave a public building.
gents	NOUN The gents is a public toilet for men.
here	ADVERS You use here when you are talking about the place where you are.
hot	ADJECTIVE Someone or something that is hot has a high temperature.
in	PREPOSITION You use in when you are saying where someone or something is.
information	NOUN Information about someone or something is facts about them.
ladies	NOUN The ladies is a public toilet for women.
lift	NOUN A lift is a device that takes people up and down a tall building.
no parking	PHRASE If a sign says no parking, you are not allowed to park your car there.
no smoking	PHRASE If a sign says no smoking, you are not allowed to smoke there.
notice	NOUN A notice is a written announcement in a place where everyone can read it.
open	ADJECTIVE When a shop or place is open, people can go into it.
out	ADVERB If you go out of a place, you leave it.
sign	NOUN A sign is a piece of wood, metal or plastic with words or pictures on it, giving information.
slow	ADJECTIVE If something is slow, it does not move or happen quickly.
stop	VERS When a moving person or vehicle stops, they do not move anymore.
telephone	Noun A telephone is the piece of equipment that you use for speaking to someone who is in another place.
toilet	NOUN A toilet is a large bowl with a seat that you use when you want to get rid of waste from your body.
