Mikhail: Do you have an approximation on cost to the airport?

Taxi Driver: Well, at this time of day, there isn't much traffic so I can take the shortest distance. It'll probably be \$34 or \$35 dollars.

Mikhail. I have a flight in three hours. How long will it take to get there?

Taxi Driver: Taking the freeway and banking on light traffic. I'd say about an hour.

Mikhail: That'll get me there in plenty of time.

[After arrival.]

Taxi Driver: What airline?

Mikhail: Worldwide Airways.

Taxi Driver: That's Terminal B which is right here.

Mikhail: How much do I owe you?

Taxi Driver: \$33.00.

Mikhail: I have \$35 here. Keep the change.


Taxi Driver: Thanks. Have a great day.
