#### **DIALOGUE - Taking the Shuttle Bus**

Mr. Jones: Ah, there, I see the sign for ground transportation.

Mrs. Jones: Do you think that is where we catch the hotel shuttle?

Mr. Jones: Yes, but let's ask.

(Mr. and Mrs. Jones walk outside. A shuttle pulls up to the curb and the door opens).

Mr. Jones: (to shuttle driver) Is this the bus that will take us to the English Savoy Hotel in midtown?

*Driver*: I have a stop on the corner of Fifth and Main; the Savoy is right there.

Mrs. Jones: Is this a free shuttle?

*Driver:* No ma'am. It's \$7.50 one way. Do you have to come back to the airport?

Mr. Jones: Yes, we do. We fly back to Denver on Sunday.

*Driver*: Then I'd buy the round-trip shuttle fare. It's \$10.00 round trip. It'll save you \$5.00 a person.

Mrs. Jones: So, then, it'll cost \$20 dollars for both of us to ride to the hotel and back to the airport.

Driver: Yes, \$20 total.

Mr. Jones: Great. Where do we buy the tickets?

*Driver*: You can buy them on the bus. Climb in and put your suitcases in the luggage rack directly behind my driver's seat.

Mrs. Jones: How will we know which stop is ours?

*Driver*: The shuttle covers many hotels in the midtown area and I'll make three stops.

**Mr. Jones:** Is the Fifth and Main stop the first, second, or third stop?

*Driver:* It's the last stop. The speaker will make an announcement that says it's the final stop and all passengers need to disembark.

Mrs. Jones: Sounds good. We'll listen carefully.

*Driver:* Thanks for choosing Hotel Shuttle Express. I hope you enjoy the ride.


