


Possessive Adjectives & Pronouns

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There are many ways to show *who* something belongs to.



Let's learn more about possessive adjectives and possessive pronouns.





A. Possessive Adjectives

Chart

		Subject Pronouns	Possessive Adjectives
	1st person	Ι	my

Singular	3rd person	he she it	his her its
	1st person	we	our
Plural	2nd person	you (plural)	your (plural)
	3rd person	they	their

Sentence Position

Possessive adjectives always go **before a noun**.

- Do you want to borrow **my** pencil?
- That's **her** cat.
- His bicycle is new.
- Their parents are sleeping.





B. Possessive Pronouns

		Subject Pronouns	Possessive Pronouns
	1st person	Ι	mine
C i	2nd person	you	yours
Singular	3rd person	he she it	his hers —
	1st person	we	ours
Plural	2nd person	you (plural)	yours (plural)
	3rd person	they	theirs

Sentence Position

Possessive pronouns never go before a noun. They take the place of a noun. They are the subject or object in a sentence, so they go **before or after a verb**.

- That book is **mine**.
- That house is **ours**.
- Yours is the chair on the left.
- His lunch isn't very good, but **hers** is.

Note:

The possessive adjective *its* can never be a possessive pronoun.

✓ The dog is eating from its bowl.

★ That bowl is **its**.

D. Commonly Confused Words


Don't get confused by these word pairs with similar sounds!

	Meaning	Examples
Your	<i>Your</i> comes before a noun and shows possession.	Is that your dog?
You're	<i>You're</i> means <i>you are</i> and is the subject/verb of a sentence.	You're not listening to me.
	Meaning	Examples
lts	<i>Its</i> comes before a noun and shows possession.	What's wrong with its paw?
lt's	<i>It's</i> means <i>it is</i> and is the subject/verb of a sentence.	lt's a nice day.
	Meaning	Examples
Their	<i>Their</i> comes before a noun and shows possession.	Their bikes are locked in the garage.
They're	<i>They're</i> means <i>they are</i> and is the subject/verb of a sentence.	They're playing in the park.
There	<i>There</i> has many meanings. Two of the most common uses are as an indefinite subject and a location.	 There is milk in the fridge. It's over there.


